#### **♦Gathering as God's People: Our Theme**

Last week we explored "The Visit of the Wise Men" in the Gospel of Matthew, taking us on their journey to find the Messiah. The reading culminated in Matthew noting that the wise ones were warned in a dream not to return to King Herod and instead, "left for their country by another road." We reflected on the potential of alternate routes in our own lives.

In preparation for this week when I heard the song, "Let Justice Roll Down," the lyric "make a new way" made me think about finding another route, another road - inviting us to consider how our lives, our journeys, are like that of the magi. We heard, "Oh children, don't you get weary, walk together, believe in the dream" - and that is just what the wise ones did.

So, we continue with the theme, "Gifts of Light," but today we will focus on the beloved community as one of those gifts of light. Last week we were paying attention to our experiences of light and how it impacts us, how we express it, share it, and where we observe it. This morning I specifically want to train our attention to our community - to what we each offer to it, what we receive from it, how we might further deepen it - and notice the gifts given to us by those who are called to bring their gifts to bear in the world as they create community among us. In this moment, it is Martin Luther King Jr. who immediately comes to mind. He shared his gifts of wisdom and insight, his capacity to be a student of nonviolence and a teacher of peace, his vision, commitment, and sacrifice. The messages he spoke to us are still painfully relevant today.

And like many of you, on January 6th - the day of Epiphany - I was mindful of the anniversary of the insurrection at the capitol, recalling that at this time last year, in the wake of that, the youngest inaugural poet in our history, Amanda Gorman, presented her inaugural poem, "The Hill We Climb." On that day, she provided so many incredible images and she built in layers of references to our history, to other writers and thinkers and artists - it felt like she was delving into our past and mining the gifts of those who represent the best of ourselves - reminding us of who we are capable of being and what we are capable of doing.

Such prophets and creators provide a plumbline - a straight edge or horizon for us to maintain in our sights as we try to manage the rocky terrain of the times we are living in.

So, in our gathering today, I welcome you to consider: what are your gifts of light? What do you have to offer the beloved community and what does the beloved community offer you?

As you tap into the Holy One's presence, you may wish to name all that you are carrying, or you may focus on the gifts that are unfolding in your life. You might take this time to open yourself to what you are gaining in this season of darkness and what you hope to discover as you seek the light in the midst of winter.
