Today is a momentous day here at Tippe, as we resume in-person worship, we also enter the Lenten season, and I finally get to gather with members of our faithing community here in this beloved space.

Let us be mindful of the gift of relationships and of community, of the many ways that we are present to one another, and the myriad ways that we experience and understand the Divine in our midst. On this first Sunday of Lent, we will look through the lens of friendship as we reflect on our relationship with Jesus, with ourselves, and with one another. We begin by listening to the words of poet, John O’Donohue, who lifts up the gift of the “soul friend,” or in Gaelic, our *anam cara*.

As we enter the Lenten season, I am basing the theme we will be exploring on a book written by Diana Butler Bass, entitled, "Freeing Jesus: Rediscovering Jesus as Friend, Teacher, Savior, Lord, Way, and Presence."


Through her text, the Bible Wisdom teachings, and our journey together, we will consider: how has your experience of Jesus changed over time? Most of us have a specific understanding or particular view of Jesus, and that can become constricting.

We end up putting Jesus in a container, and don't allow our understanding or experience of Jesus to evolve over time. Yet, as in any relationship, change happens. If we are seeking an authentic, intimate, evolving relationship with the Divine, then as Christians, we need to be intentional about the way we describe and talk about and envision Jesus. For that matter, we need to be intentional about how we interact and engage with Jesus - we shape the nature of our relationship because Jesus is already attentive to us - it is up to us to turn toward Jesus and choose to connect.

Diana Butler Bass chose six particular words, or lenses, through which to reflect on our understanding of Jesus: *Friend, Teacher, Savior, Lord, Way, and Presence*. She writes, "Let these words free you to embrace the prismatic nature of Jesus and renew your hope in the Jesus you have known, the one you know now, and the one who will meet you ahead on the road."

May we walk together on the path to better understand who Jesus is, and in turn, gain insight into who we are.
