This Lenten season we have reflected on our lives, our relationships, our practices – considering how to better align our *doing* with our *being*. Now here we are on Palm Sunday, preparing for Holy Week, a time to walk through the story of Jesus's final days and the celebration of the resurrection of the Christ, on Easter Sunday.

The ultimate question asked repeatedly of Jesus throughout the Gospels is: "Who are you?" Contemplating this multi-faceted question opens us to a deeper relationship with Jesus.

We are exploring this question with the help of Diana Butler Bass's book, "Freeing Jesus," alongside the Bible Wisdom teachings and through our journey together - experiencing Jesus anew. We strive to walk the path with humility as we listen deeply to one another and to the still, small voice within.

This week, we peel back the layers of *Jesus as Presence*. We can think about presence in at least two ways:

- o In thinking about "freeing Jesus" through the lens of "presence," we are naming the companionship and accompaniment of Jesus
- o Through being mindful ourselves, we remain present to what is unfolding around us and within us

How are we present to one another? In relationships, in caring for one another, in making a home and moving through the mundane tasks of our lives that support one another's health and safety – these are just some of the ways that we are present. The theologian Grace Ji-Sun Kim writes, "The Christian faith is different from what the world teaches. The Christian faith is not 'seeing is believing,' but rather, 'believing is seeing.' We must open our eyes and hearts and see Jesus's presence in our lives. We need to see him in the places that we dare not to look and dare not to think about."

As we have discussed over throughout Lent, uncovering language, context, and meaning, empowers us to reclaim these words, or at least consider with fresh eyes whether a particular description or experience of Jesus provides you an entry point for a more intimate relationship with the Divine.

As we discover new understandings of Jesus, we come to better understand ourselves.

May we acknowledge both the joy and the sorrow that arises in our own lives, abounds in the world around us, and is woven into the path that Jesus walks throughout Holy Week. Take time to name what you are navigating and what you are witnessing in these days. Enter the sacred hush and leave your burdens with God.

Holy Spirit, may we hear your precious word for us today. May we grow in wisdom, strength, and love as we open our ears, our minds, and our hearts to the transformative message you have in store for each of us. Amen.
