### **♦Gathering as God's People: Our Theme**

In this season as we take stock and consider where we have been and where we feel led to go, we are reflecting on the gifts within us and around us.

Over the past month, we have explored individual spiritual gifts as well as the needs and the gifts woven through our connections to the wider world. Last week, Betty led you through an experiential worship service that lifted up the gift of spiritual practices and embracing the traditions of our indigenous brothers and sisters.

Let us continue to consider: How might our spiritual gifts support and strengthen our community? How are we supported and strengthened by others? When have we come to recognize a spiritual gift and how/when did we use it?

An important aspect of using our spiritual gifts is honing the ability to notice/recognize/hear/witness our spiritual gifts. Central to that ability is our self-awareness alongside the nature of our connection with the Divine/to the sacred. Today we will consider the words from one of the prophetic books of the Bible: Habakkuk. The theologian, Eugene Peterson, observes that Habakkuk is the kind of prophet, that instead of speaking God's Word to us, is actually speaking our word to God. I certainly appreciate someone else speaking on my behalf, sometimes! He describes Habakkuk as our "...companion who stands at our side," waiting and listening. Habakkuk's waiting and listening turns into praying. This is a deep comfort at times when we are hurting, when we've been waiting for insight or understanding, when we can't figure out the next step and wonder how to move forward.

This week, let's make space for questions, admit to confusion and impatience, name our grief – and in the process, notice the depth of our relationship with God and to each other as we walk alongside one another.

#### **♦Bible Wisdom Teaching Habakkuk 1:1-4; 2:1-4**

The oracle that the prophet Habakkuk saw. O LORD, how long shall I cry for help, and you will not listen? Or cry to you "Violence!" and you will not save? Why do you make me see wrong-doing and look at trouble? Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise. So the law becomes slack and justice never prevails. The wicked surround the righteous-therefore judgment comes forth perverted.



I will stand at my watchpost, and station myself on the rampart; I will keep watch to see what he will say to me, and what he will answer concerning my complaint. Then the LORD answered me and said: Write the vision; make it plain on tablets, so that a runner may read it. Their spirit is not right in them, but the righteous live by their faith.
