

#### **♦**Gathering as God's People: Our Theme ~ Gifts and Gratitude

Today as we celebrate All Saints Day, we reflect on the gifts others have shared with us through their example. Our memories and experiences bring up feelings of both grief and gratitude. As we celebrate and honor those who have gone before us, we also have the opportunity to appreciate the people who continue to walk alongside us and reveal to us how to walk the path of healing and wholeness.

In the course of experiencing and pondering the turn of seasons, I have come to recognize that certain times of the year hold special power and intrigue for me. Like the lines of energy that some suppose run through the earth, concentrating at sacred sites, the spiraling seasons contain an energy that intensifies for me at particular times. The trinity of days at the end of October and beginning of November mark such a time: Halloween, the Feast of All Saints, and the Feast of All Souls inevitably herald some sort of turning as the year draws to its end. Why these days hold such power for me, I'm not sure; whether it's because they occur in the unfolding of fall, my favorite season, or because long ago ancestors celebrated these holy days or simply because they capture my imagination, I don't know. But I have learned that it pays to be attentive to what appears in this trio of days.

In the ancient Celtic calendar, the festival of Samhain fell around November 1 and marked the turning of the year from summer to winter. The ancient Celts believed that at this turning, the gates between this world and the otherworld of the dead swung open, allowing for contact between the living and those who had gone before. After the rise of Christianity, this festival became known as the Feast of All Saints or the Feast of All Hallows, during which prayers were said for the faithful departed. Many of the traditions of the old Samhain festival, however, lingered in celebrations held on the day before All Saints: October 31, known as all Hallows eve or Halloween. The feast of All Souls, celebrated on November 2, became a time to pray for the souls of all departed Christians.

Let us open our eyes to the gifts that God provides through the people we encounter in our daily lives and through our cherished memories.
