♦Time for Young Hearts A reflection on the power of love

♦Gathering as God's People ~ Our Theme: *To Love and Be Loved*

Throughout this Eastertide, as we move toward Pentecost, we hear about the appearances that Christ made to the followers of Jesus after the Resurrection, and how they began to spread Jesus' teachings while also feeling unsure, worried, anxious, and full of doubt.

Jesus consistently taught and preached and acted out of love, and this continued after the Resurrection. The Christ continued to model love and compassion as the early followers attempted to find their way. In the coming weeks we will be exploring the many expressions and layers of love, and consider: how we express our love, the ways that love builds resilience and courage, and vision what the world can look like where love is more freely given and received.

Our conversation partner will be Sam Keen, an American author, philosopher, and lecturer known for his insightful writings on a wide range of topics including psychology, spirituality, and personal growth.

One of Keen's most notable publications is the influential book "Fire in the Belly: On Being a Man," published in 1991. In this groundbreaking work, he explored the challenges and expectations placed upon men in modern society and offered insights on how to transcend traditional gender roles and find fulfillment and purpose.

His text, "To Love and Be Loved" will be our resource for inspiration as he articulates the many "elements of love" that make up the full spectrum of human affection — empathy, commitment, attention, and compassion, to name a few. Keen taps into mythology, ancient wisdom, and a variety of spiritual traditions, integrating them with psychological approaches that provide a holistic understanding of the human experience.

While reflecting on our lived experience, may we find our way forward together as a beloved community committed to love, compassion, and empathy.

Acts 3: 12-19



To this we are witnesses. 16 And by faith in his name, his name itself has made this man strong, whom you see and know; and the faith that is through Jesus has given him this perfect health in the presence of all of you.

17 'And now, friends, I know that you acted in ignorance, as did also your rulers. 18 In this way God fulfilled what he had foretold through all the prophets, that his Messiah would suffer. 19 Repent therefore, and turn to God so that your sins may be wiped out.
