

\$Gathering as God's People: *Those Who Dream*

This season's Advent theme comes from the opening lines of Psalm 126: "When the Lord restored the fortunes of Zion, we were like those who dream." We are invited to consider what it looks like to live as those who dream, as we listen closely to the voices of those who dream: the prophets, the psalmists, the angels, Mary and the Magi, and this week, to John the Baptist, who prepares the way for the Messiah. He calls the crowds into the journey of repentance and transformation. Similarly, we are called to prepare the way for God's message of love and liberation to be shouted, heard, and received.

Throughout Advent, we step into the mystery and awe of God's dreams and pray they shape our reality. This theme is for the dreamers in all of us—those who dream of a deeper connection with God and those who dream of a better world. It's for those who dream of comfort and for those who have given up on their dreams. It's for those whose dreams have been crushed and for those who show us that dreams take time. Let us seek and sow God's dreams for our world.

Isaiah 40: 1-11 40 Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God. ² Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from God's hand double for all her sins. ³A voice cries out: "In the wilderness prepare the way of Yahweh; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. ⁴ Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. ⁵Then the glory of the Sovereign shall be revealed, and all flesh shall see it together, for God has spoken." ⁶A voice says, "Cry out!" And I said, "What shall I cry?" All flesh is grass; their constancy is like the flower of the field. ⁷The grass withers; the flower fades, [when the breath of Yahweh blows upon it; surely the people are grass. ⁸The grass withers; the flower fades,] but the word of our Sovereign will stand forever. ⁹Get you up to a high mountain, O Zion, herald of good news; lift up your voice with strength, O Jerusalem, herald of good news; lift it up, do not fear; say to the cities of Judah, "Here is your God!" ¹⁰ See, the Sovereign comes with might, whose arm rules: the reward is with God and God's recompense is before God. ¹¹God will feed God's flock like a shepherd: God will gather in the lambs and carry them in God's bosom and gently lead the mother sheep.
