

**♦**Gathering as God's People: Our Lenten Theme – Wandering Heart

Throughout Lent, as we focus on the life and faith of the disciple, Peter, we'll witness a flawed follower of Jesus. In Peter, I imagine we'll see ourselves, and by following Peter's journey, we'll watch the story of Jesus unfold through the eyes of a human trying to figure it all out, just like we are.

Our liturgical resource, "A Sanctified Art," invites us to delve into the lyrics of "Come Thou Fount." For each step in Peter's journey, there is a selected phrase from that hymn – the phrase this week is, "Rescue Me From Danger." As we first gathered this morning, we sang about God rescuing us from danger and guiding us safely home.

The Bible Wisdom teachings this season reveal how faith is a constant journey of steadfast pursuit, one that ebbs and flows. We are reminded that wandering is exploration, not necessarily distance from God. Through the Gospel stories we'll notice how Peter just keeps going: he drops his nets, he walks on water, he runs to the empty tomb, he swims to the shore to meet the risen Christ. He keeps searching and yearning and loving, even after missteps or mistakes.

The Gospel story we'll hear today makes you wonder if, as a new disciple, maybe Peter wants to prove himself. Boldly, in the middle of a storm, Peter steps out of the boat to join Jesus who is walking on top of the waves. Peter walks on water until the wind shakes his trust and he begins to sink. Many of us know what it feels like to be thrown off balance, to feel as if we're sinking. Maybe this looks like doubt, unexpected change, a too-busy season of life, devastating grief, or feeling distant from God. We can relate to the desperation Peter feels as he cries out - we pray for God to save us when we sink.

This is the reality of life and faith: inevitably we will face many emotional, relational, professional, physical, and global dangers. The lyric for this week speaks to the desperation we feel when these dangers are imminent. It also acknowledges all who may be offering this prayer as a desperate plea—all in need of rescue, as this morning's poem so beautifully articulated.

May we come to know these stories on a deeper level and tap into their wisdom as we wander and explore.

#### Psalm 22: 23-31

You who fear the Sovereign, praise God!

All you offspring of Jacob, glorify God;

stand in awe of God, all you offspring of Israel!

<sup>24</sup> For God did not despise or abhor

the affliction of the afflicted;

God did not hide God's face from me,

but heard when I cried to God.

- <sup>25</sup> From you comes my praise in the great congregation; my vows I will pay before those who fear God.
- <sup>26</sup> The poor shall eat and be satisfied;

those who seek God shall praise the Sovereign.

May your hearts live forever!

<sup>27</sup> All the ends of the earth shall remember

#### Matthew 14: 22-33

Jesus Walks on the Water

<sup>22</sup> Immediately he made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. <sup>23</sup> And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, <sup>24</sup> but by this time the boat, battered by the waves, was far from the land, for the wind was against them. <sup>25</sup> And early in the morning he came walking towards them on the lake. <sup>26</sup> But when the disciples saw him walking on the lake, they were terrified, saying, 'It is a ghost!' And they cried out in fear. <sup>27</sup> But immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, 'Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid.'

<sup>28</sup> Peter answered him, 'Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.' <sup>29</sup> He said, 'Come.' So Peter got out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came towards Jesus. <sup>30</sup> But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, 'Lord, save me!' <sup>31</sup> Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, 'You of little faith, why did you doubt?' <sup>32</sup> When they got into the boat, the wind ceased. <sup>33</sup> And those in the boat worshipped him, saying, 'Truly you are the Son of God.'

One: May we hear anew the origin stories of our faith and draw from the roots of our tradition.

All: Thanks be to our God.
