

♦Gathering as God's People: Our Theme – Knowing and Being Known

What does it truly mean to be *known*? We all want people to notice us, to really understand us. We all want to be known for who we truly are and still loved. We all want to know others in the same way.


To know and be known is a relationship. It's what we all desire, whether it is from friends, parents, a romantic partner, or a close-knit community. But something gets in the way. In many of our relationships, we are not known or understood in the way we wish. Most of the time our relationships are not as strong as we'd like. We begin to wonder if it is even possible to be known.

Tomorrow, we honor Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. As we do so, we attempt to recognize what we have in common with one another while also celebrating the range of differences among us. We consider how to live among one another and recognize our

humanity and advocate for equity and access for all. Martin Luther King spoke, at every opportunity, about love, and inviting us to be in relationship with one another. While speaking to a group of students at Cornell College in 1962, he said, "I am convinced that men hate each other because they fear each other. They fear each other because they don't know each other, and they don't know each other because they don't communicate with each other, and they don't communicate with each other because they are separated from each other."

This morning we'll hear the psalmist say, "Oh God, you have searched me and known me!" God knows every part of us – every gift and every flaw. And yet God still loves us. To be fully known and fully loved? That is what we all desire.

On this second Sunday after Epiphany, we will explore texts that have to do with being known. We will contemplate being in relationship with God while reflecting on the challenge, the comfort, and the call of knowing and being known.

1 Samuel 3:1-20

Now the boy Samuel was ministering to Yahweh under Eli. The word of the Sovereign was rare in those days; visions were not widespread.

At that time Eli, whose eyesight had begun to grow dim so that he could not see, was lying down in his room; the lamp of God had not yet gone out, and Samuel was lying down in the temple of the Sovereign, where the ark of God was. Then Yahweh called, "Samuel! Samuel!" and he said, "Here I am!" and ran to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call; lie down again." So he went and lay down. Yahweh called again, "Samuel!" Samuel got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." But he said, "I did not call, my son; lie down again." Now Samuel did not yet know Adonai, and the word of Yahweh had not yet been revealed to him. The Sovereign called Samuel again, a third time. And he got up and went to Eli, and said, "Here I am, for you called me." Then Eli perceived that Yahweh was calling the boy. Therefore Eli said to Samuel, "Go, lie down; and if God calls you, you shall say, 'Speak, Adonai, for your servant is listening." So Samuel went and lay down in his place.

Now the Sovereign came and stood there, calling as before, "Samuel! Samuel!" And Samuel said, "Speak, for your servant is listening." Then Adonai said to Samuel, "See, I am about to do something in Israel that will make both ears of anyone who hears of it tingle. On that day I will fulfill against Eli all that I have spoken concerning his house, from beginning to end. For I have told him that I am about to punish his house forever, for the iniquity that he knew, because his sons were blaspheming God, and he did not restrain them. Therefore I swear to the house of Eli that the iniquity of Eli's house shall not be expiated by sacrifice or offering forever. "Samuel lay there until morning; then he opened the doors of the house of the Sovereign. Samuel was afraid to tell the vision to Eli. But Eli called Samuel and said, "Samuel, my son." He said, "Here I am." Eli said, "What was it that God told you? Do not hide it from me. May God do so to you and more also, if you hide anything from me of all that he told you." So Samuel told him everything and hid nothing from him. Then he said, "It is the Sovereign; let Yahweh do what seems good to Yahweh."

As Samuel grew up, God was with him and let none of his words fall to the ground. And all Israel from Dan to Beer-sheba knew that Samuel was a trustworthy prophet of the Sovereign.

Psalm 139:1-6, 13-18


139:1 O God, you have searched me and known me. 139:2 You know when I sit down and when I rise up; you discern my thoughts from far away. 139:3 You search out my path and my lying down, and are acquainted with all my ways. 139:4 Even before a word is on my tongue, O God, you know it completely. 139:5 You hem me in, behind and before, and lay your hand upon me. 139:6 Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is so high that I cannot attain it.

139:13 For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. 139:14 I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; that I know very well. 139:15 My frame was not hidden from you, when I was being made in secret, intricately woven in the depths of the earth. 139:16 Your eyes beheld my unformed substance. In your book were written all the days that were formed for me, when none of them as yet existed. 139:17 How weighty to me are your thoughts, O God! How vast is the sum of them! 139:18 I try to count them - they are more than the sand; I come to the end -- I am still with you.
