



## A Blessing Called Sanctuary ~ Jan Richardson

You hardly knew how hungry you were to be gathered in, to receive the welcome that invited you to enter entirely—nothing of you found foreign or strange, nothing of your life that you were asked to leave behind or to carry in silence or in shame.

Tentative steps became settling in, leaning into the blessing that enfolded you, taking your place in the circle that stunned you with its unimagined grace.

You began to breathe again, to move without fear, to speak with abandon the words you carried in your bones, that echoed in your being.

But the deal with this blessing is that it will not leave you alone, will not let you linger in safety, in stasis.

## **♦**Gathering as God's People: Vitality in Community

## **♦Bible Wisdom Teachings – Deuteronomy 8:7-18**

<sup>7</sup> For God is bringing you into a good land, a land with flowing streams, with springs and underground waters welling up in valleys and hills, <sup>8</sup> a land of wheat and barley, of vines and fig trees and pomegranates, a land of olive oil and honey, <sup>9</sup> a land where you may eat bread without scarcity, where you will lack nothing, a land whose stones are iron and from whose hills you may mine copper. <sup>10</sup> You shall eat your fill and bless God for the good land given to you.

<sup>11</sup> "Take care that you do not forget the God by failing to keep God's commandments, ordinances, and statutes that I am commanding you today. <sup>12</sup> When you have eaten your fill and have built fine houses and live in them <sup>13</sup> and when your herds and flocks have multiplied and your silver and gold is multiplied and all that you have is multiplied, <sup>14</sup> then do not exalt yourself, forgetting God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, <sup>15</sup> who led you through the great and terrible wilderness, an arid wasteland with poisonous snakes and scorpions. God made water flow for you from flint rock. <sup>16</sup> God fed you in the wilderness with manna that your ancestors did not know, to humble you and to test you and in the end to do you good. <sup>17</sup> Do not say to yourself, 'My power and the might of my own hand have gotten me this wealth.' <sup>18</sup> But remember your God, for it is God who gives you power to get wealth, so that God may confirm the covenant sworn to your ancestors, just as God is doing today.

### 2 Corinthians 9: 6-15

6 The point is this: the one who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and the one who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. 7 Each of you must give as you have made up your mind, not regretfully or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. 8 And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that by always having enough of everything, you may share abundantly in every good work. 9 As it is written,

"They have freely scattered their gifts to the poor; Their righteousness endures forever."

10 Those who supply seed to the sower and bread for food will supply and multiply your seed for sowing and increase the harvest of your righteousness. 11 You will be enriched in every way for your great generosity, which will produce thanksgiving to God through us, 12 for the rendering of this ministry not only supplies the needs of the saints but also overflows with many thanksgivings to God. 13 Through the testing of this ministry you glorify God by your obedience to the confession of the gospel of Christ and by the generosity of your partnership with them and with all others, 14 while they long for you and pray for you because of God's surpassing grace given to you. 15 Thanks be to God for God's indescribable gift!


